## Detailed Trainings information

### 1. Training of Trainers for Peacebuilding Practitioners in Post Conflict settings in Africa; Nairobi, Kenya (& also online on Zoom): 29<sup>th</sup> April to 3<sup>rd</sup> May & 29<sup>th</sup> July to 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2024

#### Introduction

This training is ideal for practitioners working in post conflict settings in Africa who have the following interests:

- Keen to increase their understanding of post conflict peacebuilding
- Keen to improve their skills and knowledge in organizing, designing, facilitating and evaluating trainings.

The initial part of the training will focus on highlighting some of the post conflict settings in the Horn of Africa, the Great Lakes and East Africa regions. Participants will also be introduced to practical tools that can be used to analyse conflicts as well as have an opportunity to explore their post conflict settings.

The larger part of the training will be dedicated to themes that are relevant to organizing, designing, facilitating and evaluating trainings.

#### Key areas of Focus in the Training;

1. An overview of selected post conflict settings in the Horn of Africa, East Africa and Great Lakes region
2. Exploration of key concepts: Conflict, Peace, Violence and Post-conflict contexts
3. Introduction to conflict analysis tools relevant for post conflict settings
4. Peacebuilding Fundamentals for Post Conflict settings
5. Creating a learning environment
6. Introduction to Adult learning
7. Exploring the issues in training for peacebuilding and conflict transformation
8. Designing a training: *Determining participants, conducting formative evaluations and drafting the training Curricula*
9. Formulating Training and Learning objectives
10. Exploring and practising on different training Methodologies
11. Facilitation skills; *The art of facilitation and relevant qualities and skills required for facilitators*
12. Understanding our roles as facilitators and as trainers
13. Designing and conducting an online training

### **What participants will get from the Training**

1. An overview of some of the post conflict settings in the Horn of Africa, East Africa and Great Lakes Region
2. Working knowledge of some tools of conflict analysis
3. A clearer understanding of peacebuilding fundamentals for post conflict settings
4. A better understanding of what a peacebuilding and conflict transformation training entails in terms of content depending on the context and the group
5. A clearer understanding of how to conduct a formative evaluation of participants to determine training needs
6. A clear understanding of how to design a training curricula
7. A better understanding of how to craft both training and learning objectives
8. Facilitation skills
9. A better understanding of how to design and facilitate an online training

## **2. Training in Monitoring, Evaluation, Reporting & Learning; Nairobi, Kenya (& also online on Zoom): 27<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> May, 30<sup>th</sup> September to 4<sup>th</sup> October and from 9<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> December 2024**

### **In this MERL training participants will learn and practice on:**

1. Key concepts and fundamentals in MERL
2. Developing project implementation and monitoring plans
3. Applying different monitoring tools to our projects
4. Developing of Project Indicators
5. The development of the Log Frame and Results Based Framework
6. Theory of Change
7. Development of evaluation plans, schedules and TORs
8. Writing project reports

### **The Course Content**

#### **Introduction to key concepts and fundamentals of MER**

In this session, participants will explore and unpack common terminologies used in MERL. These include Monitoring, Evaluation, Reports, Goals, Objectives, Activities, Inputs, Outputs, Outcomes, Results/Impact and Stakeholders.

## **Developing Effective Implementation Plans**

This session will take participants through step by step guide on developing projects implementation plans. There will also include practical sessions on crafting of Project Goals, Objectives and how best to capture activities and sub-activities.

## **Introduction to project Monitoring**

In this session, focus will be on the different forms of project monitoring (Process, Results and Contexts). In addition, participants will explore and practice on different monitoring tools such as the Benchmark Calendar, the Deliverable Schedule and the Activity Based Budget. Out of this session, participants will develop implementation and monitoring plans for their projects based on the different tools

## **Understanding the Results Based Framework and the log frame**

This session will take participants through the development of a results based framework using the 4 different levels of results i.e. Inputs and Processes, Outputs, Outcomes and Impacts. The session will also focus on the development of log frames. From this session, participants will develop their projects log frames and results based framework clearly showing the linkages from one level to the next.

## **Developing project's 'Theory of Change'**

This session will focus on what a theory of change is, its relevance in the project cycle management and how it is crafted. From the session, participants will be able to develop and articulate their project's theory of change.

## **Introduction to Indicators**

This session will take participants through what indicators are and why they are important in MER. There will be discussions on the criteria used to develop quality indicators. Participants will practice formulation of indicators across different levels of their projects results.

## **Developing Evaluation Plans, Schedules & TORs**

This session will take participants through what evaluations are and how evaluation plans for projects are developed. From this session, participants will be in a position to develop evaluation plans and evaluation TORs and schedules for their projects.

## **Reports**

This session will explore various forms of reporting and outline the key elements that a good programme/project report should contain. From this session, participants will be able to do reports that show linkages between the various levels of the activities i.e. outputs, outcomes and the impact report.

## Expected Training results

- Participants will be able to articulate the MERL concepts, their linkages and importance in projects/programmes
- Participants will be able to develop implementation and monitoring plans for their projects/programmes
- Participants will be in a position to develop log frames and results based frameworks for their projects/programmes
- Participants will be able to formulate and articulate theories of change for their projects/programmes
- Participants will be able to develop indicators for the different results levels in their projects/programmes
- Participants will be able to develop evaluation plans for their projects/programmes
- Participants will be able to do reports that capture the goals, objectives and the results achieved at the different levels of their log frames or results framework

## 3. Training in Peacebuilding Programming in Post Conflict settings in Africa; Nairobi-Kenya & Online: 24<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> June & from 25<sup>th</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup> November 2024

### Key areas of Focus in the Training;

1. Exploration of some of the post conflict contexts in selected countries in Africa depending on where participants will be drawn from
2. Exploration of tools of analysis relevant for post conflict settings
3. Developing post conflict peacebuilding plans: *Designing short and long term peacebuilding interventions at regional, national and community levels*
4. Exploration of what peacebuilding and conflict transformation entails in a post-conflict setting
5. The African Union Post Conflict Reconstruction and Development Policy Framework (2006) and its relevance to the continent's peacebuilding programming
6. Understanding cycles of violence using the healing centred approaches to peacebuilding
7. Gender in post conflict settings: Using the United Nations Security Council Resolution (UNSCR) 1325 to engender peacebuilding work

### What participants will get from the training

1. A more informed view of various post conflict scenarios in a number of countries in Africa (based on where training participants will be drawn from)
2. Tools for real time conflict analysis in post conflict contexts
3. Short and long term peacebuilding programming options for post conflict settings
4. A more informed understanding of what peacebuilding and conflict transformation entails in post conflict settings

5. A better understanding of the provisions of the African Union Post-Conflict Reconstruction and Development Policy Framework (2006)
6. Exploration of Breaking cycles of violence and healing centred approaches in post conflict settings
7. Ideas on how to incorporate gender in their post-conflict peacebuilding using the United Nations Resolution Council 1325

## **Content Overview**

### **Overview of the post conflict scenarios in different post conflict countries in Africa**

In this session, participants will explore various post conflict countries represented in the training. This will also involve exploration of possible peacebuilding options in each context.

### **Tools of Analysis**

This session will explore different tools and analyse real time conflicts in some of the countries using various tools of analysis. This will be an opportunity to further dissect some of the post conflict contexts in the countries represented in the training

### **Short-term and long term programming options for post conflict peacebuilding**

This session will explore programming options relevant to post conflict settings with a point of reference being the African Union's Post Conflict Reconstruction & Development Policy Framework (2006) and other relevant policy frameworks developed by different institutions. Participants will also be provided with real time case studies that will enable them identify possible programming options in their contexts.

### **Exploration of Peacebuilding and Conflict Transformation for post conflict settings**

This session will involve deeper exploration of both peacebuilding and conflict transformation and what each entails in a post conflict environment.

### **Understanding cycles of violence and the relevance of healing centred approaches in post conflict settings**

Violence is widespread in post-conflict settings at individual, community and structural levels. This violence affects our peacebuilding work and also negatively affects relations at different levels. This session will explore how violence at different levels is inter-linked and how this contributes to cycles and unsustainable peace. Healing strategies for the different levels will also be explored and discussed.

### **Gender in post-conflict settings: Gendering peacebuilding work using the United Nations Security Resolution 1325**

This session will explore how the UNSCR 1325 can inform the way women are engaged in our peacebuilding processes and how we can localize it in our initiatives. Video case studies of successful women led peacebuilding processes will be shared and discussed.
